EVERYTHING OLD IS NEW AGAIN!

The book of Ecclesiastes tells us, "What has been, that will be; what has been done, that will be done. Nothing is new under the sun." I have thought about that reading over the last couple of weeks here at Resurrection. We have been discussing the possibility of moving the music ministry with the liturgy committee, the pastoral council, staff, and other folks. And every time we make the suggestion of moving it, someone inevitably says, "That's where it used to be!" There really is nothing new under the sun!

This week, we will be busy about the work of moving the music ministry. The move will:

- Help us to meet existing pastoral needs
- Be Consistent with solid liturgical principles
- Is Reversible and will be Evaluated

EXISTING PASTORAL NEEDS

Moving the music ministry from its current location to its former location will enable us to add seating at one of our busiest pastoral times of the year...Easter! We will move the ministry from its existing position to an area near the ambo (pulpit) thus allowing for the entire "upper area" where the musicians are currently located to be used for seating. We will gain far more seats than we will lose by reducing the number of pews in our one quadrant near the ambo.

Another existing pastoral need is that our cantors and song leaders are not always visible. Their ability to lead the assembly in praise will be enhanced in this move. Additionally, the music ministers cannot always hear the assembly.

CONSISTENT WITH SOLID LITURGICAL PRINCIPLES

The conference of Bishops released a document entitled, "Sing to the Lord." The document states, "Musicians and musical instruments should be located so as to enable proper interaction with the liturgical action, with the rest of the assembly, and among the various musicians. Ideally, ministers of music are located as to enable their own full participation by being able to see and hear the Liturgy. In most cases, it will work best if musicians are in close proximity with each other—for example, by placing the organ console or keyboard close to the choir and to the cantor's stand." This movement will allow us to achieve that goal.

REVERSIBLE AND EVALUATED

All the changes are being done in time for the Easter Vigil. There is a general guiding principle that if you design a church for the Easter Vigil, the "mother of all vigils," then you have pretty much designed the church for all Sundays of the liturgical year.

Our changes will not be permanent, we want to evaluate the acoustics, the sight lines, the participation of the assembly, the increased seating capacity, and a million and two other things. We will leave this change throughout the entire Easter season, and perhaps beyond if it works out.
