DOUBTING THOMAS

Picture this. The year is 1929, the setting was the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California. It was the biggest football game of the season for USC and Georgia Tech. Sometime during the second quarter, Roy Riegels, the center for USC recovered a Georgia Tech fumble. He took off at full clip for the end zone, which was 65 yards away. He was heading for glory. The only problem is that Roy Riegels was heading the wrong way! Ever since that day, he was known as "Wrong Way Riegels!"

I think of him when I read today's Gospel. If we ask most people what today's Gospel is about, they would say, "Oh, it was the story of Doubting Thomas." Doubting Thomas and Wrong Way Riegels have something in common. We know them both by their worst day. Thomas was the one who said of Jesus earlier, "Let us go with him and die with him." He was willing to die with Christ. Thomas is the one who profoundly says in today's Gospel, "My Lord and my God!" Such an act of faith! Yet, he is not known as "My Lord and My God Thomas" or "Let us go with him and die with him Thomas." Wrong Way and Doubting are known by their worst act on their worst day.

Lord, spare us all from that! Spare us from being called by our worst act. I won't even tell you what my name would be. To tell you the truth, I can't even narrow it down. But how would you like to hear, "Oh, there's Lying Maria," or there goes "Cheating Joe."

The story of Thomas gives us all permission to have great faith with occasional doubts. Recall the story from the ninth chapter of Mark's Gospel. A man's son is in terrible distress that he has suffered since childhood. The dad asks Jesus to heal him, and Jesus says in return, "Everything is possible to one who has faith." The dad's response is the response most of us give at sometime...the dad responds, "I do believe, help my unbelief." The story of Thomas tells us that great men and women of faith can have doubts.

May each of us who doubt be given a double portion of faith. May each of us show the love and courage of Christ that Thomas did. And may each of us never be known by our worst act on our worst day!
