The Invisible Ones

I once drafted my nephew to help me set up for an event at a parish. After the event was over, there was a reception for all of the guests. Bishop Madden was in attendance along with a number of priests, and a couple hundred other people. This was a catered event and the food was quite wonderful. I went back to thank the caterer and his staff for making our reception spectacular (and well within budget!). One of the women said to me, "I understand that a bishop is here tonight. Is it that man over there?"

I told the woman that was not the bishop, and quickly pointed him out. She told me, "I have never been this close to a bishop. I have never been this close to someone famous. I am so excited just to be here." I asked the woman if she would like to meet the bishop, who, by this point began to put on his coat to leave the event. I went over and asked the bishop if he wouldn't take a minute to speak with the staff in the kitchen.

Well, the bishop didn't take a minute. Instead, he took twenty minutes. He spoke to this woman and others, even though he was on his way out. The workers in the kitchen engaged the bishop in conversation and spent a good bit of time laughing. The bishop took a few extra minutes with the woman who wanted to meet him. When he left, she started to cry and said "Bishop Madden made me so special, of everyone in this room, I was special!" She couldn't wait to tell her family.

My nephew watched the interaction, and spent the rest of the night talking about the bishop... how the bishop took the time and used his "power" to touch a woman's life. He said, "that bishop has a great gift." That night, my nephew learned the importance of making the invisible visible. Jesus had a gift for that. Jesus saw people on the side of the road that others passed by. Jesus saw Zacchaeus up in a tree when no one else spotted him. And, in this weekend's Gospel, host and guests are concerned that Jesus does not recognize the woman in their midst as a sinner. They are concerned. Jesus addresses their concern by asking a question. He asked a question that anyone preparing for ministry, be they in liturgy, music ministry, working with the RCIA or small children, teenagers, or ministering to those who are ill should remember. Jesus turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman?" "Do you see this woman?"

Jesus realized that Simon saw the woman's sinfulness, but may not have actually seen her for all that she was. He may not have recognized the woman's opportunity to change, to turn. He may not have seen her for who she really was. But looking at the woman's faults, he missed her tears. By looking at her sinfulness, Simon missed her washing the feet of Jesus, and drying them with her hair. By wondering with all the others in the room "how could Jesus not know who this woman is" he failed to see the goodness of the woman who anointed the feet of Jesus with oil.

"Do you see this woman?" Bishop Madden did. Jesus did. May God give us the grace to do the same.
