When I first met Tara, I met her as “Phil’s little sister, Tara.” Kids in the youth group said that phrase as if it were her real name, “Phil’s little sister, Tara.” Phil was an all star in our youth ministry. He was devoted to our church, and came to almost every event. His sister Tara would come along with him from time to time.

What struck me about Tara was her gentleness. Tara had a great sense of humor and was fully engaged in life. But there was a gentleness about her that was calming to be around.

Well, Phil’s little sister grew up to be a gentle teenager who spent sometime studying Catholicism and justice. And she wondered why there were so many hungry people in a society that had such an abundance. She asked herself what Jesus would do, and she began leading a group that would make sandwiches for people who were hungry and homeless in the city. As a young person, she would go and distribute the food. Tara brought joy along with sandwiches.

Tara started attending college, making new friends, being the gentle person that she was as a small child. One night, while on break from college, Tara was riding with friends. Her vehicle was hit by a tractor trailer, and Tara died. The driver of the tractor trailer jumped an intersection where the light was not working.

Tara’s parents could have become bitter. Instead, they picked up Tara’s causes, and her cause became theirs. They too are active in the Church. They support youth justice programs like the one that Tara learned so much from. They have gone on to support the Catholic college that Tara attended. They have shared their story and Tara’s story from a faith perspective that let’s people know that even in the most difficult of times, God is present in our lives.

In today’s Gospel, we encounter a person that promises to follow Jesus, once his family obligations are complete. Jesus re-defines family for this person. Jesus re-defined family for Tara...her family included the hungry of Baltimore City. He re-defined family for Tara’s parents as well. Their family now includes the young people they inspire with Tara’s story, and the good work they do. And for me, well, their family has been forever re-defined in my mind. The next time I introduce a former member of the youth group, I will say, “This is Tara’s brother, Phil.”

Phil would have no greater honor than to be introduced that way.

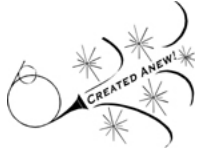

**FIXING HEALTH CARE A LEGISLATIVE GOAL OF US BISHOPS.** . In a recent letter to Congress, Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, said with PPACA (the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act) was an important step toward ensuring access to health coverage for all Americans but was "profoundly flawed in its treatment of abortion, conscience rights, and fairness to immigrant." . . . . . "Efforts to ensure that our health care system truly serves the life, health and conscience of all will be a legislative goal of the Catholic bishops in the months to come." On April 22, Rep. Joseph Pitts (R-PA) introduced legislation (H.R. 5111) to remedy PPACA's serious problems on abortion. Among others, the bill would prevent PPACA from requiring abortion coverage or paying for abortion.
