With much excitement, I am pleased to announce that there have been several new families joining our faith community! Every time I look out from over the piano, I see warm familiar faces welcoming new visitors and guests to our celebrations. As a growing congregation, I challenge you to meet someone new every weekend. Worship is enhanced when we are familiar with our brothers and sisters—our cries of pain are healed with songs of comfort—our moments of joy are escalated with shouts of happiness.
